#### Assessment

You are taught through a combination of interactive workshops, lectures, seminars, fieldwork, practical activities etc. Interactive workshops take a variety of formats and are intended to enable the application of learning through discussion and small group activities.

Each module will have an associated pre-read/material (this could be video material etc.) and students will be expected to complete the pre-work so that this can be built on in the face-to-face taught workshops.
